Steve Burnett as our guest preacher!** Steve is married to Ingrid, an artist in pastels and oils, a second career for her after more than twenty years in university libraries and museums. He is proud of his daughter Sarah Fischer (a kindergarten teacher at Antelope Trails Elementary), who lives in Colorado Springs with her husband Steve and their daughters Ellen and Ada. Upon earning his Doctor of Ministry degree from Claremont School of Theology in California, Steve returned to serve in his native Mississippi Conference in local churches and a term as Conference Director of Youth, Young Adults and Outdoor Education. In 1984 he transferred to the Rocky Mountain Conference where he served pastorates in Colorado Springs, Steamboat Springs, Pueblo and Casper, WY. He served six years as a district superintendent in northern Colorado and two years in the greater south Denver and Colorado Springs area. After "retiring" in 2014, Steve has been coaching pastors, teaching adult classes, serving on the Mountain Sky UM Foundation Board, and in 2018 completed an interim pastorate at Trinity UMC in Denver. He chaired the Program and Arrangements Committee for the 2016 Western Jurisdictional Conference in Scottsdale, AZ. He enjoys travel (non-COVID era), rare books, reading, gardening, and takes his frustrations out weekly on golf balls. Steve and Ingrid were part of the core team that came out from the downtown campus of FUMC to start the Prairie Campus and they have given their hearts and souls to helping it grow, including being on the music team, setup coordinators, small group leadership, etc.
